What this highlighted to me was that we as an arts audience are often so hunrgy for these types of show, we will pretty much pay anything.

Marianda is an artist who uses journals in a variety of ways in her practice. Some are hand-made, some are repurposed, some contain notes and drawings showing the progression of thoughts, some are drawings as a record of a particular event, period of travel or Urban Sketching. There are even some collaborative ones and......not all are finished! About 15 of these books will be available to look at, feel and ask questions about.

In addition, many of the artists exhibiting in Paper, Ink, Metal, Thread have kindly loaned the journals they made in response to a 30 day challenge issued last year, to be seen collectively. Varied topics and interesting uses of paper will give plenty of inspiration for anyone wanting to take up this sort of challenge themselves, plus hand-made blank journals will be available to purchase after the talk. Suitable for anyone who is interested in developing the ways they use journals, as part of their personal development, artistic learning or just for fun. This is an informal session designed to encourage questions and discussion.

AMMW2: Paper and wire landscapes with Alysn Midgelow-Marsden

<u>Date:</u> Saturday 17 February 2018 in Studio 1 <u>Time:</u> 10am – 4pm <u>Duration:</u> 6 hours / 1 day

Price: Cost \$70 pp (Members) plus \$10 each for materials payable to tutor Cost \$80 pp (Non-Members) plus \$10 each for materials payable to tutor Create an artistic impression of a landscape using waxed papers and wires.

Have fun with hot wax, metallic wax, irons and paper to create fantastic surfaces for embellishment. We all have plenty of scrap paper from bags, old books, music scores, catalogues and wrappings amongst others, you might also have a stash of exotic handmade papers and decorated papers. Take this chance to transform them into a collage which can be used on its own or as a basis for stitch with thread and wire. In this workshop you will sample the effects and techniques then make one or more pieces to take home. You will not only create your own artwork but learn techniques to apply again later for yourself.

MTW2: Endings Notebook with Marianda Twydell and Karen Williamson

In this work shop you will make a personalised notebook designed as a simple tool for organising your personal data and wishes regarding end of life decisions and after-death care. Working with this notebook on a continuing basis can be a profound and enriching experience. "Embracing and accepting that the life we know is temporary is a powerful statement about how we choose to live". (Schorr, Rooney & Emmons). This workshop is for those who like to plan ahead, those who would like to give one to a friend or family member to start the conversation, professionals working in end-of-life care.

To get the greatest benefit from this unique workshop, spend time considering and noting down your thoughts on who this notebook is for.... what is of importance to you to incorporate into your journal. This could include personal items of significance such as fabrics, letters, photographs, keepsakes, documents (originals or photocopies), maps, recipes, poems etc.

Additional information will be emailed a week before the course. Paper, card, ink, paint, dyes, sewing machines, thread, needles and glue is provided by tutors.

Special considerations: This is an intensely personal and sensitive topic. This workshop is designed for people for whom death is not a live issue. It is not intended to be grief counselling, a therapy session or a venue to share grief issues. If you are recently bereaved you may find this workshop challenging. We will endeavour to keep the group 'safe' and will create space at the conclusion for a de-brief.
